

How many EVs are there in Bangkok?

The service currently operates in 12 areas of Bangkok, including popular spots like Chula-Samyan and Sukhumvit. How many EV charging stations are there in Thailand?

As of 2023, there were approximately 2,658 charging stations serving 196,991 new EV car registrations in Thailand. Of these, 51% are Battery Electric Vehicles (BEV), 43% are Hybrid Electric Vehicles (HEV), and 6% are Plug-in Hybrid Electric Vehicles (PHEV).
