Lithium-ion battery fires burn fiercely, are difficult to extinguish and can spread quickly. If your home has electrical products that have lithium batteries, take note of the safety messages below.

Battery gases, vapour and smoke are highly toxic and flammable and must not be inhaled. If anyone has been exposed to battery fluids, debris, smoke, vapours, or flames, seek urgent medical assistance.

It is vital that a high level of care and Risk Management is undertaken in order to safely use, store, re-charge, and dispose of any Lithium Ion battery. The following safety guidelines should be followed for ...
