In Naypyitaw, the capital, government personnel have moved to modular low-cost prefabricated buildings built around the compound of the central railway station while debris is still ...

The earthquake also caused significant destruction beyond the capital. In total, over 5,400 government buildings, 52,000 homes, 2,600 schools, 600 hospitals and clinics, and 250 hotels ...
